



- Gandhi ji and Manila Doctor both fought for the Abolition of Indian Indentured Labour, which was finally stopped in 1924.

- Dr. K. Hazareesingh former DG Mahatma Gandhi Institute even wrote to him and got a reply thereafter.


These actions of his changed the history of Mauritius.


- Gandhi ji's Salt march on 12th of


is no stranger to Fiji. He has in fact served in Fiji at one of the most interesting times in our history, and

10th October 1970 was a moment of pride for all Fijians as we received the instruments of independence after some 96 years of colonial rule.

Fijians celebrated our national day in Fiji and around the world, with the theme "A Transformed, Inclusive, and United Fiji" on Monday, 10th October with the customary address by His Excellency Ratu William Katonivere, the President of the Republic of Fiji where he noted with pride how Fiji saw a peaceful transition to independence, from a low-income agrarian economy with limited resources to seeing remarkable progress and developments over the past 52 years.

President ICCR, Today, Fiji is a middle-income, service driven economy, with notable progress in socio-economic, educational, cultural, political and especially our otherspheres of life.

That strength we saw by way of



This year marked 143 years of presence of the Girmiteer's, and we remembered and celebrated their contributions in the development of














# His Majesty The King of Bhutan on a Royal Visit to India

# Their Majesties celebrate Dassian with the people of the Hindu Community













A 3-day Durga puja was held at the Lingkana Palace, and tika imbued with blessings were sent to all dzongkhags to be distributed to the people.



Dassain tika is traditionally placed upon the forehead of family members by the head of the family, symbolizing the bonds that ties families together.



World Mental Health Day is observed every year on 10th October. This year's global theme is "Making Mental Health & Well-Being for All a Global Priority."

The event included the launch of a website and social media handles for The PEMA Center Secretariat, Hospital-based Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment and Care Services, The PEMA Helpline Services and Anti-bullying Guidelines.



The website and social media handles will serve as a platform to update information and activities related to mental health and ease accessibility to services.

The PEMA helpline services will include counselling services, mental health service information, mobilizing psychosocial support, referral and follow up. These services can be availed through 1010 and 112. Mental Health related calls will be directed to The PEMA Centre Helpline numbers.

Hospital-based Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment and Care Services is established to provide an effective referral pathway for persons with SUD through a continuum of care approach. This will offer an increased access to evidence-based SUD treatment practices at the Jigme Dorji Wangchuck National Referral Hospital, which will be extended to other regional referral/district hospitals in time.

The Anti-bullying Guidelines for educational institutions have been developed to nurture a safe and harmonious learning environment for children and youth. The guideline will provide a strategic reference for educational institutions to support their anti-bullying initiatives.



These initiatives and services are geared towards promoting and supporting psychosocial wellbeing of all Bhutanese.

On 14 of October 2022 (Friday) at the Malviya Smriti Bhawan, Diaspora Research and Resource Centre (DRRC) – Antar Rashtriya Sahayog Parishad (ARSP) hosted an interactive session for the 40



participants of 61st KIP batch from 7 countries namely- Guyana, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, Mauritius, Myanmar, South Africa, and Fiji.

H. E. Kamlesh Shashi Prakash, High Commissioner of the Republic of Fiji, H.E. Mr. Arunkoemar Hardien, Ambassador of the Republic of Suriname, and H.E. Dr Roger Gopaul, High Commissioner of the Republic of Trinidad & Tobago graced the occasion with their presence. Mr. M S Patiyal, Director, (OIA-II), MEA also attended the event. Eminent Professor Surendra Gambhir from University of Pennsylvania, USA was the Chief Guest of the occasion.

This time the students and faculty of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, Delhi University also joined the programme. The main highlight of the event was the vibrant interaction between the students and the KIP participants. They exchanged their views, thoughts and desire to work in

collaboration for the betterment of their countries.

**Prof. Gopal Arora,** Secretary, ARSP introduced the works of ARSP and its linkages with diaspora for nearly five decades. He also informed them about the diaspora related activities especially for youth organised by DRRC.

Amb Anup Mudgal, founder Chairperson, DRRC spoke about the contemporary developments in India and also the latest on the Diasporas activities and performances. He also highlighted that DRRC has been set up to carry the discourse with diaspora to more substantive areas and transform the way of engagement with diaspora. He mentioned that DRRC is trying to bring the youth from diaspora and from India in the same platform so that they can discuss and share their vision and dreams, since the best ideas and practices emerged though discussion.









Prof. Surendra Gambhir spoke about the language preservation and language loss in various communities in India's diaspora. He briefed the participants about the studies in language contact situations. He also mentioned about the koineization process in theoretical linguistics. He exclaimed that languages of diaspora are bound to disintegrate due to coming in contact with other dialects, but he suggested that India can help in preservation of the language by sending experts from India and introducing Hindi as a foreign

H. E. Kamlesh Shashi Prakash, High Commissioner of Fiji urged the KIP participants to use this KIP platform as a foundation to connect with diaspora youth. This is a great opportunity to engage and connect with India. He asked them to cherish these memories and share their wonderful experiences with others.

> back with rich experiences and lessons learnt for better addressing some of their own socio economic


challenges.

(Ms) Manika Jain, Additional Secretary, OIA-II, MEA chaired the session. H.E. Dr Roger Gopaul, High Commissioner of the Republic of Trinidad & Tobago was the Chief Guest of the occasion. The session was moderated by Dr Jasvinder Kaur Bindra, Writer & Assistant Professor, SGND Khalsa College.


**Dr. Gurmohinder Singh,** Principal, SGND Khalsa College, in his welcome remarks mentioned that diaspora has recently emerged as an important subject of research. The contributions of diaspora are immense. They act as the building bridges between India and their

adopted countries. He also said that Ministry has initiated various valuable schemes and policies for diaspora. He congratulated everyone and stated that this course will be beneficial in providing comprehensive and systematic study on diaspora.

# जब बापू 75 वर्ष के हुए





गांधी जीवे वर्ष शत, देश होय स्वाधीन! शांति स्थापन होय जग, मारग चलव नवीन!! उपरोक्त पंक्तियां महामना पं. मदन मोहन मालवीय की हैं, जब महात्मा गांधी 1944 में 75 वर्ष के हुए थे। उस समय गुलाम देश ने गांधी जी के जन्मदिवस पर अमृत महोत्सव मनाया था। आज देश अपनी आजादी का अमृत महोत्सव मना रहा है। ऐसे में उत्सुकता जागृत होना स्वाभाविक है कि आजादी से पहले महात्मा गांधी का अमृत महोत्सव कैसे मनाया गया था और देश में क्या भावना थी।

देश में आजादी को लेकर चारों ओर अंग्रेजों के विरुद्ध वातावरण बना हुआ था, देश के कोने—कोने में गांधी जी की अहिंसा के सिद्धांत के कारण आम आदमी भी देश की आजादी में अपनी आहुति देने के लिए तत्पर था। ऐसे में देश के कोने—कोने में गांधी जी के 75वें जन्मदिन पर अनेक कार्यक्रम आयोजित हुए और उनकी लंबी आयु की कामना की गई। इन तमाम अभिनंदन कार्यक्रमों के बीच में एक महत्वपूर्ण साहित्यक कार्य सोहन लाल द्विवेदी ने किया कि गांधी जी पर एक अभिनंदन ग्रंथ सम्पादित किया। इस अभिनंदन ग्रंथ की भूमिका सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन ने लिखी थी। उन्होंने अपने भावों को इस प्रकार व्यक्त किया था कि जब तक सभ्यता का चिह्न संसार में रहेगा,

गांधी जी का नाम आदर के साथ स्मरण किया जाएगा। उन्होंने कहा कि जो उद्देश्य हम युद्ध के द्वारा प्राप्त करना चाहते हैं वे तो शांतिमय साधनों से भी प्राप्त हो सकते हैं। बर्बरतापूर्ण संसार में गांधी जी ही सच्चे प्रेम के तत्व को ग्रहण करने में अग्रगण्य हैं। उस समय इस अभिनंदन ग्रंथ के प्रकाशन में घनश्याम दास बिरला ने 1000 रुपये का सहयोग प्रदान किया था। वे कहते हैं कि गांधी जी की 75वीं जन्मतिथि के उपलष्य में तरह—तरह के आयोजन हो रहे हैं।

महापुरुषों के तनिक संपर्क से भी पुण्य की वृद्धि होती है। इसलिए गांधी जी के संपर्क से इस ग्रंथ के द्वारा जो कुछ पुण्य लाभ हो उससे हम सबका कल्याण हो, ऐसी हमारी प्रार्थना है। पुरुषोत्तम दास टंडन ने कहा था कि महात्मा गांधी हमारे देश की अनुपम विभूति हैं। उनको पाकर हम अपनी दरिद्रता में भी भाग्यवान हैं। साधारण रीति से 75 वर्ष की आयु में मनुष्य क्षीण शक्ति हो जाता हैं। किंतु अपने बापू की कल्पना हम सशक्त महारथी के रूप में करते हैं। उनकी बहुत आवश्यकता है। हमें इस आयु से संतोष नहीं। उनके 100 वर्ष पूर्ण होने की लालसा हमारे हृदय में भरी है। गोपीनाथ बारदोलाई ने अपनी भावना को इस प्रकार व्यक्त किया, 'मेरे लिए तो कोई भी कविता इतनी ऊंची नहीं हो सकती, जो महात्मा जी के अंतर की सहृदयता को व्यक्त कर सके, न ही कोई ऐसी भाषा ही समृद्ध जान पड़ती है, जो गांधी जी के जीवन की गरिमा को लिख सके।' इस प्रकार तमाम महापुरुषों ने गांधी जी को 75वें जन्मदिन पर बधाई दी और अपने भावों को व्यक्त किया। यह महत्वपूर्ण तथ्य है कि आजादी के बाद भले ही हिंदी को राजभाषा का दर्जा मिला हो किंतु आजादी से पहले हिंदी को राष्ट्रभाषा का दर्जा दिया जाता था। सोहन लाल द्विवेदी अपने संपादकीय में लिखते हैं कि हमें यह लिखते हुए गर्व होता है कि संसार की किसी भी भाषा में ऐसा ग्रंथ आज तक प्रकाशित नहीं हुआ, जिसमें संसार के सर्वश्रेष्ट पुरुष के संबंध में इतनी भाषाओं के कवियों की कविताएं एक स्थान पर संग्रहित की गई हों। यह सौभाग्य राष्ट्र भाषा हिंदी को प्राप्त हुआ है, अतः यह प्रत्येक राष्ट्र भाषा प्रेमी के लिए गर्व का विषय है।

सुब्रह्मण्यम भारती कहते हैं कि धन्य गांधी जी आपने भारतवर्ष के उद्धार के लिए अवतार ग्रहण किया है, जहां दिरद्रता का आज भी तांडव हो रहा है। जो अपनी स्वतंत्रता से वंचित है, जो पतन के गर्त में समा गया है। मूर्छित लक्ष्मण को नागपाश से मुक्त करने वाले महावीर के समान आप हैं यह कहें या इंद्र के कोप से उंगली पर गोवर्धन धारण करने वाले गोपाल कहकर आपकी प्रशंसा करें? असीम दुःख देने वाली परतंत्रता की व्यथा को दूर करने के लिए आपने ऐसी औषधि का आविष्कार

किया है जो संसार के लिए अभिनव ही नहीं, अपितु सुलभ भी है। रामलिंगम पिल्ले ने कहा कि आज गांधी जी के तप की शक्ति ने संसार को आक्रांत किया है। छल और कपट राख हो गए हैं। वाद—विवाद ठंडा पड़ गया है। सारी दिशाएं स्तंभित रह गई हैं। दीन—दुखियों के बंधु गांधी जी की जितनी भी प्रशंसा करें कम ही है।

सरोजिनी नायडू ने लिखा था कि तुम्हारे परिवर्तनहीन आंखों ने युगांतों के दृश्य उत्थान और पतन देखा है। तुम्हारी ये गंभीर भविष्यदर्शी आंखें भविष्य का क्या रूप देख रही है? इसमें संहार की स्थिति और लय इतनी तीव्र और कितनी अभृतपूर्व है। मेरी सिग्रिस्ट ने लिखा है कि यह कौन है, जो जगत के बीच से उस ओर चला जा रहा है, ईसा या बुद्ध? इस साधारण मार्ग पर शांति का यह अवतार जिसके माध्यम से विश्रामहीन भारत चरम चेतन की ओर आकर्षित है। इस प्रकार उपरोक्त चंद भाव तत्कालीन विद्वानों के हैं। कवि सुमित्रानंदन पंत ने लिखा था तुम मांसहीन तुम रक्तहीन, हे अस्थि–शेष तुम अस्थिहीन!तुम शुद्ध बुद्ध आत्मा केवल, चिर पुराण, हे चिर नवीन!! वीर रस की कवियत्री सुभद्रा कुमारी चौहान ने गांधी जी के अहिंसा के सिद्धांत को अपनी कविता में इस प्रकार वर्णित किया था बह चली तोप, गल चले टैंक, बंदूकें पिघली जाती हैं!सुनते ही मंत्र अहिंसा का अपने में आप समाती हैं !! पाषाण हृदय जो थे देखो वे आज पिघल कर मोम हुए, मैं 'राम' बनू इस आशय से 'रावण' के घर में होम हुए !!

इस प्रकार गांधी जी के सम्मान में तमाम देश के तत्कालीन वरिष्ठ कवियों और महावपूर्ण लोगो ने अपनी भावनाओं को व्यक्त किया है। जब सोहन लाल द्विवेदी ने बापू को यह ग्रंथ भेंट किया तो उन्होंने सेवाग्राम से एक पत्र लिखा,

भाई सोहन लाल जी,

आपकी कृति के गुण दोष बारे में मैं क्या कहूं? काव्यों की परीक्षा करने की मेरे में कोई योग्यता नहीं पाता। मेरी स्तुति में जो काव्य लिखे गए हैं, उस बारे में मैं क्या कह सकता हूं? हाँ, इतना मैं कह सकता हूं, आपने परिश्रम काफी उठाया है। कोई भी शुभ परिश्रम व्यर्थ नहीं जाता है।










### भारतीय श्वाधीनता के अमृत महोत्शव के अवशर पर विशेष





फ़िशक़ गोरखपुरी (28 अगस्त 1896 -3 मार्च 1982)

रघुपित सहाय "फ़िराक़" (28 अगस्त 1896 —3 मार्च 1982), उन्हें उनके शायरी के उपनाम "फ़िराक़" गोरखपुरी से अधिक जाना जाता है, उर्दू भाषा के प्रसिद्ध रचनाकार है। उनका जन्म गोरखपुर, उत्तर प्रदेश में कायस्थ परिवार में हुआ। रामकृष्ण की कहानियों से शुरुआत के बाद की शिक्षा अरबी, फ़ारसी और अंग्रेजी में हुई। बाद में फ़िराक़ साहब इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय में अंग्रेजी के अध्यापक रहे और उर्दू भाषा में अपनी रचनायें कीं।

कला स्नातक में पूरे प्रदेश में चौथा स्थान पाने के बाद आई.सी.एस. में चुने गये। 1920 में स्वराज्य आंदोलन में कूद पड़े। इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय में 1930 से लेकर 1959 तक अंग्रेजी के अध्यापक रहे। उनकी उर्दू काव्यकृति 'गुले नगमा' को साहित्य अकादमी पुरस्कार, ज्ञानपीठ पुरस्कार और सोवियत लैंड नेहरू पुरस्कार से सम्मानित किया गया। बाद में वे साहित्य अकादमी के सदस्य भी मनोनीत हुए। फिराक़ गोरखपुरी को साहित्य एवं शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में सन 1968 में भारत सरकार ने पद्म भूषण से सम्मानित किया।





फ़िराक़ ने अपने साहित्यिक जीवन का श्रीगणेश गज़ल से किया था। फ़िराक़ ने परंपरागत भावबोध और शब्द-भंडार का उपयोग करते हुए उसे नयी भाषा और नए विषयों से जोड़ा। फारसी, हिंदी, ब्रजभाषा और भारतीय संस्कृति की गहरी समझ के कारण उनकी शायरी में भारत की मूल पहचान रच-बस गई है।
