GUYANA'S IRFAAN ALI IS SWORN IN FOR THE SECOND TIME AS PRESIDENT AND DR. BHARRAT JAGDEO AS VICE PRESIDENT





Guyana's Mr. Irfaan Ali of the ruling People's Progressive Party was sworn on 07 September, 2025 for a second term as President of the oil-rich South American nation after his victory was ratified by the Electoral Commission. Having channeled revenues from the country's relatively recent oil wealth into popular social programs, Ali vowed that he would build a diversified economy that would create jobs, raise incomes and secure prosperity. In the September 1 election, the People's Progressive Party/Civic won

36 seats, three more than in the previous one. Ali's government, which took office in 2020, has invested in the construction of roads, schools, and hospitals, and has made tuition at the state university free. Ali said that our oil and gas sector will continue to grow, expanding production and revenue for the people.

In keeping with his constitutional authorities, President Dr. Mohamed Irfaan Ali appointed Brigadier (Ret'd) Mark Phillips and Dr Bharrat Jagdeo as Prime Minister and Vice President respectively on 2 Sep 2025. The two men served in the last dispensation of the Ali-led administration between 2020 and 2025.

Dr. Bharrat Jagdeo (born 23 January, 1964) is a known Guyanese politician who has been serving as Vice President of Guyana since 2020. He had previously also held the office from 1997 until 1999, during the Presidency of Janat Jagan. He was President of Guyana from August 11, 1999 to December 3, 2011. He received the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman from the President of India in the field of public affairs in 2004.

Chief Justice of India Mr. Bhushan Ramkrishna Gavai spoke as a keynote speaker in Nepal-India Dialogue on recent jurisprudence and Justice sector reform in Kathmandu. The Dialogue saw participants of Indian delegation, working judges of Supreme Court and High Courts, former Chief Justices of Nepal, advocates of human rights and climate change and other stakeholders. CJI Gavai said the judiciary serves as a guardian and it not only ensures justice but upholds constitution by ensuring equality and human dignity. Mr. Prakashman Singh Raut, Chief Justice of Nepal, emphasised that India and Nepal not only share close borders but also strong bond in professional exchange in the legal sector. There has been continuous judicial cooperation between the two neighbours. Previously, in 2024, CJI D.Y. Chandrachud paid a three-day official visit to Nepal at the invitation of Chief Justice of Nepal Mr. Bishwambhar Prasad Shrestha.

INDIA-FIJI JOINT STATEMENT: PARTNERSHIP IN THE SPIRIT OF VEILOMANI DOSTI



At the invitation of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, the Hon'ble Prime Minister of the Republic of Fiji, Mr. Sitiveni Rabuka, paid an official visit to the Republic of India from 24 to 26 August 2025. Prime Minister Rabuka, who is on his first visit to India in his current capacity, visited New Delhi, with his spouse; Hon'ble Mr. Antonio Lalabalavu, the Minister for Health and Medical Services; and a delegation of senior officials of the Government of the Republic of Fiji. Prime Minister Modi warmly welcomed Prime Minister Rabuka and his delegation. The Leaders held comprehensive and forward-

looking discussions on the full spectrum of bilateral matters, and regional and global issues of mutual interest. Both leaders expressed satisfaction at the growth of the relationship and reaffirmed their resolve to build a broad-based, inclusive, and forward-looking partnership in areas such as defence, health, agriculture, agro-processing, trade and investment, development of small and medium enterprises, cooperatives, culture, sports, education and skill development.

Both leaders noted with satisfaction the momentum gained in bilateral exchanges in recent years, including the historic first-ever visit of the President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, to Fiji in August 2024. They recalled the successful hosting of the 12th World Hindi Conference in Nadi, Fiji, in February 2023, which celebrated the shared linguistic and cultural heritage between India and Fiji. The Leaders reaffirmed the deep-rooted and long-standing relationship and strong people-to-people ties between India and Fiji. They acknowledged the contribution of the Girmitiyas, over 60,000 Indian indentured labourers who arrived in Fiji between 1879 and 1916, in shaping Fiji's multicultural identity, diverse society and economy. Prime Minister Rabuka appreciated the visit of the Minister of State for External Affairs and Textiles, Shri Pabitra Margherita, to the Republic of Fiji to attend the 146th Girmit Day commemoration in May 2025.



Both Prime Ministers reaffirmed their commitment to supporting an open, inclusive, stable and prosperous Indo-Pacific where sovereignty and territorial integrity are respected. Prime Minister Rabuka expressed Fiji's interest in joining the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI). Prime Minister Modi welcomed Fiji into this partnership with like-minded countries which seek to manage, conserve and sustain the maritime domain. Prime Rabuka highlighted the concept of the 'Ocean of

Peace' which emphasizes building a peaceful, stable, secure, and sustainable future and well-being for our region. Prime Minister Modi commended Prime Minister Rabuka for his leadership in championing 'Ocean of Peace' in the Pacific Region. Prime Minister Rabuka expressed heartfelt appreciation to the Government and people of India for the warm hospitality extended to him and his delegation. He extended an invitation to Prime Minister Modi to undertake a visit to Fiji.

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA MODI VISIT TO JAPAN IN AUGUST 2025 FUSION OF TECHNOLOGY OF JAPNA AND TALENT OF INDIA



Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that both countries have set a target of 10 trillion-Yen investment in India from Japan in the next 10 years.

Japanese companies have invested more than \$40 billion in India. In the last two years alone, there has been private investment of \$13 billion in India. Both leaders, Prime Ministers of India Mr. Narender Modi and Japan's Prime Minister Shigeru met for the 15th India-Japan Annual Summit of 2025. During the India-Japan Annual Summit of 2025, the Prime Ministers of India and Japan

concurred on the need to foster deeper understanding between their citizens through visits and exchanges, and to find collaborative avenues for their human resources to co-create values and address respective national priorities. Accordingly, the public and private sectors in India and Japan will endeavour to expand exchange of personnel to serve as a bridge between the two countries in the next generation. The two countries have set an aspirational target of the exchange of more than 500,000 personnel in both directions in the next five years, including 50,000 skilled personnel and potential talents from India to Japan, to create a new wave of people to people exchanges between India and Japan. The volume of India-Japan bilateral trade was recorded at \$22billion in 2023-2024. Technology of Japan and talent of India can together load the tech revolution of this century.

PRIME MINISTER RECEIVES A DARUMA DOLL FROM REV SEISHI HIROSE, CHIEF PRIEST OF THE SHORINZAN DARUMA-JI TEMPLE



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi was presented a Daruma doll on 29 August, 2025 by Rev Seishi Hirose, Chief Priest of the Shorinzan Daruma-Ji temple, Takasaki-Gunma. This special gesture reaffirms the close civilizational and spiritual ties between India and Japan. The Daruma doll is considered auspicious and a good luck charm in Japanese culture. Takasaki City in Gunma is the birthplace of the famous Daruma dolls. The Daruma tradition in Japan is based on the legacy of Bodhidharma, an Indian monk from Kancheepuram, known in Japan as Daruma Daishi, who is said to have travelled here over a thousand years ago.

PRIME MINISTER INTERACTS WITH GOVERNORS OF PREFECTURES OF JAPAN





Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi met with the Governors of various Prefectures of Japan. Sixteen Governors participated in the interaction. DIASPORA IN THE CARIBBEAN: SURINAME GHAT AS PART OF MARITIME HISTORY TO UNDERGO MAKEOVER IN KOLKATA, INDIA



In a significant step towards rejuvenating Kolkata's iconic riverfront, Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata (SMP, Kolkata) and M/s Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd. (GRSE) on 06 August 2025 signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for beautification of Surinam Ghat and development of Mayer Ghat. The agreement, inked at SMPK's Head Office, marks a shared commitment to enhancing public infrastructure and reviving the historic charm of the ghats as part of the port's broader

Swachhata Initiatives.GRSE will beautify Surinam Ghat and will take development work at Mayer Ghat under CSR. SMP Kolkata, recognising the social and cultural significance of the projects, has extended full support to GRSE for the execution and subsequent upkeep of the redeveloped sites. This strategic partnership underscores the growing collaboration between public sector entities in reimagining and reviving urban spaces. The beautification of Surinam Ghat and development of Mayer Ghat is expected not only to uplift the local environment but also to reconnect citizens with their rich riverine heritage. The initiative stands as a model of how synergy between heritage-conscious planning and

corporate responsibility can create lasting impact on the civic and cultural fabric of the city. Suriname Ghat marks a poignant chapter in history. Between 1873 and 1916, over 34,000 indentured labourers—mainly from Bihar and Uttar Pradesh—embarked from here to Suriname, shaping its society and culture despite harsh beginnings. The first ship, Lalla Rookh, departed in 1873, carrying 410 passengers. Mayer Ghat, close to Bagbazar, holds spiritual significance. It was used by Ma Sarada during her visits to Udbodhan Patrika. Both the ghats echo Kolkata's rich maritime and cultural legacy, with roots tracing back to the 1500s when European traders frequented the Hooghly.



PRIME MINISTER PARTICIPATED IN THE 25TH SCO SUMMIT IN TIANJIN, CHINA



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi participated in the 25th Meeting of the Council of Heads of State of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), held in Tianjin, China, from 31 August to 1 September 2025. The Summit witnessed productive discussions on SCO Development Strategy, Reform of Global Governance, Counter-Terrorism, Peace and Security, Economic and Financial Cooperation, and Sustainable Development

Addressing the Summit, Prime Minister highlighted India's approach to strengthening cooperation under the SCO framework. In this regard, he noted that India seeks greater action under three pillars – Security, Connectivity and Opportunity. Emphasising that peace, security and stability remain key to progress and prosperity, he called upon member countries to take firm and decisive action to fight terrorism in all its manifestations. Prime Minister underlined the need for coordinated action against terror financing and radicalization. Thanking member countries for their strong solidarity in the wake of the Pahalgam terror

attack, he emphasized that there should be no double standards in dealing with terrorism and urged the group to hold countries who perpetrate and support cross-border terrorism accountable. Highlighting the role of connectivity in fostering development and building trust, Prime Minister stated that India strongly supported projects such as Chabahar port and International North-South Transport Corridor. He also spoke about opportunities in the fields of start-ups, innovation, youth empowerment and shared heritage, which must be pursued under the SCO umbrella. Prime Minister proposed commencing a Civilizational Dialogue Forum within the group to foster greater people-to-people ties and cultural understanding. Prime Minister expressed support for the reform-oriented agenda of the group. In this regard, he welcomed the setting up of centres to deal with organized crime, drug trafficking and cyber security. He called for a similar approach by the group to reforming multilateral institutions, including the United Nations.

Prime Minister thanked President Xi Jinping for his warm hospitality and congratulated him for the successful organization of the Summit. He also congratulated Kyrgyzstan on taking over the next Presidency of SCO. At the conclusion of the Summit, the SCO Member countries adopted the Tianjin Declaration.

MR. DEOROOP TEEMAL -TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO




