The Appleby Horse Fair is 250-year-old, globally popular 4 day-long fair that takes place at Cumbria in North West England. This year, it is expected to see 30,000 visitors at the fair. Roma/Gypsies/Travellers ride and wash their horses in the River Eden and this tradition continues since the 20th century. As per available records, the fair started in 1775 with the aim of selling horses, sheep and cattle. Since 1990, it has evolved as a major traveller event that attracted families from across the UK and Europe.

Roma in Romania soon have a National Museum of History and Culture

The Senate in Romania adopted on 17th May the legislative proposal for establishment of the National Museum of History and Culture of the Roma in Romania. The museum will showcase collections of artifacts and documents, contributed by the Pro-Europe Roma Party Association in collaboration with other public or private institutions, non-governmental organizations from the country and abroad. Deputy Catalin Manea, who is representative of Roma in Parliament and is the initiator of this proposal, said that the construction of the museum was a reparative step and would also counteract negative stereotypes related to the Roma community. The Culture Committee of the Chamber of Deputies and Human Rights Commission have adopted a favourable report for the proposal.

Gypsy, Roma and Travellers Suffer 'Persistent' Discrimination in UK

The Council of Europe committee noted shocking levels of bullying in the education system, prejudices in the media and threats to legal status and rights of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller, as a result of recent legislative changes. Europe's leading human rights body has also reported the consistent discrimination against Gypsy, Roma and Travellers (GRT) in the UK. The Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act (PCSCA), having criminalized the trespass with the vehicle, appears to the GRT Community as a criminalization of the option of the last resort of Gypsies and Travellers in England.

Report on Roma Community in Poznan, Poland

The Roma community has been living in Ponzan, Poland for the last many years though their presence in Poland dates back to the 15th century. Roma housing estate in Lechicka Street, with an area of several hectares, accommodates over 100 Romani people. The houses have been built from various types of countertops, cabinets, doors or boards but there is no adequate access to drinking water and electricity. The area has one water intake, two portable toilets, garbage containers and waste segregation containers which do not meet basic need of amenities, but causing the deprivation of the community. Cultural, Historical, Linguistic and Legal Position of Roma in Slovenia

Centre for Roma Studies and Cultural Relations (CRSCR)-Antar Rashtriya Sahayog Parishad (ARSP) organized the Twenty-third Virtual Lecture of its Monthly Lecture Series on the theme of "Cultural, Historical, Linguistic and Legal Position of Roma in Slovenia" on 31st May, 2023. Dr. Vera Klopcic, Assistant Professor- the Faculty of Law in Maribor and Honourable Member of the Roma Union of Slovenia in her lecture gave an overview of historical and contemporary situations and issues of Roma in Slovenia. She pointed out that integration of Roma in Slovenia was faced with stereotype and discrimination similar to other countries of Europe. The stereotypes are based on exclusion owing to a lack of communication between Roma and non

Roma. The majority community is not ready to accept a nomadic way of life of Roma. She further stated that Roma community was well known across Slovenia as collector of natural and medicinal herbs.
